4. Planning application	DC/14/2542/FUL and DC/14/2543/LBC Alterations to existing outbuilding including conversion into residential use. Existing cart lodge to be altered and repaired and internal alterations to kitchen area within Farm House at 1 Dock Farm. This application was supported.
5. Planning Application	<p>a) DC/14/2393/FUL The replacement of cradle swing, Boyton Village Hall. The application was supported (4 agreed, (including 1(in absentia), 1 abstained and 1 against). It was agreed that the return to SC planning dept. should state: Boyton Parish Council support the application with the following observations:</p> <p>There is insufficient equipment to meet the needs of children and young people who live in the village and the play area falls below LEAP standard. This application is supported but should be regarded as stage 1 of re-equipping the area taking account of residents identified wishes and in line with the Leisure strategy of Suffolk Coastal.</p> <p>b) It was also agreed that the establishment of a working group to secure additional equipment (as stated above) should be included as an agenda item at the next meeting.</p>
